from the Pastor's desk

Dear Members and Friends of Faith Lutheran Church,

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

This month, I would like to share a message about coming back to church after COVID.

As a preface, I have to acknowledge that the pandemic is still ongoing. And in fact, right here in Minnesota, we are currently experiencing yet another surge in COVID cases. For that reason, Faith Lutheran Church remains committed to taking all necessary precautions in order to keep our members and friends safe whenever we gather. I would like to emphasize that we still need to stay vigilant, as we head into the summer months. We are still wearing masks...we are still keeping a good 6' social distance between family units...we are still refraining from singing during worship. And we are keeping up, for now, the 10 AM radio program, so that those who wish to continue worshipping from home may do so.

Right now, many members and friends of Faith are joining us for our in-person Sunday morning worship. To those who are—it is a true highlight of my week to see you all, and I cannot tell you how much it means to me, to be able to worship with you, as the gathered body of Christ. Meanwhile, other members and friends of Faith are staying at home on Sunday mornings for reasons of safety. To those who are staying home—please know that I understand, support, and encourage your commitment to preserving your health, and the health of our community. Thank you for doing your part to get us safely through the pandemic!

But, sooner or later—and perhaps sooner!—the pandemic will recede to the point where it is safe for just about everybody to resume worshipping, in-person, here at church. When that day comes, I would like to encourage every member and

friend of Faith to come back to life together here at church. Don't stay at home, hunkered down in front of your screens. Don't let temporary pandemic habits become permanent patterns of isolation. When the time is right for you and your family, come, rejoin us, in-person, once again!

Why? A wise member of Faith said it best. In a conversation she shared with me a few months ago, this member said, ***"You need the church, and the church needs you!"***

"You need the church!" And that need is real. You need to hear the Christ-focused, cross-centered message of hope that we preach, Sunday by Sunday. You need to receive the sacrament of the Lord's Supper. You need to be uplifted and encouraged in faith by the prayer and worship of God's people. You need the face-to-face friendship, fellowship, and support of your brothers and sisters in Christ. You need to experience the reality of real life together within the Christian church. Yes, real life together within the Christian church can be messy and unpredictable. But ultimately, real life together within the Christian church is profoundly good. It is the way God meant us to be. We are not lone wolves, but sheep in a big flock. The Bible says, ***"It is not good that a man should be alone" (Genesis 2:18)***. You need the church!

And, "the church needs you!" Faith Lutheran Church cannot survive without the active participation of her members. Your offerings of presence, prayer, financial support, time, and talent are what allow this congregation to function. Music and worship, care of the building, Sunday school, putting on the Fall Festival—all of this happens through the volunteer efforts of the members and friends of Faith. If you don't show up, it won't happen! Our general operating funds and mortgage payments—virtually all of our financial resources are provided by the generous donations of members and friends. If you don't give, the bills won't get paid! Spreading God's Word within the local community, outreach to those in need, sharing the love of Christ with those who don't yet know him—these, too, are the works of members and friends of Faith. If you don't become a messenger of the gospel, who will? The point is this—if Faith is going to thrive in 2021 and beyond, the church needs you to be involved.

So, stay safe as you and your family navigate what we hope are the final months of the COVID-19 pandemic. If you are staying home to stay healthy, I support you in doing so. But, when the time is right, make sure you come back to church. Come back to worship...come back to fellowship...come back to Bible study...come back to lend your prayers, presence, money, time and talent to the work of this congregation...come back to growing in faith, together.

You need the church, and the church needs you!

Building and Grounds Assessment

The church council is working on improving the building and property of Faith, and maintaining the facility. The council has done an external and internal audit of the building and grounds to see what needs to be repaired, replaced, or updated. Why? To provide a safe and clean environment, and to perform the ministry of God's work at the church through the upkeep and improvement of the church facilities.

You'll see some changes taking place in the next several weeks and months. The blue room has received a fresh coat of paint, thanks to many volunteers. One of the problems with that room has been noise and echo. Putting carpet on the floor is not feasible since the room is basically used for serving meals, plus it would be a huge expense. Fabric on the walls would facilitate sound absorption so we have decided to ask members to bring in homemade, smaller wall-size quilt hangings, baby quilts or lap quilts to display on the walls. Bring as many as you want. We will rotate the display every few months. If you're willing to share some of your beautiful artwork please give it to Gloria Colbenson or Lana Gilberts. Attach your name to the quilt.

With the expertise of an artist and decorator, colors for the green room are now being considered. If you would like to help paint, please let Lana or Gloria know.

As we work on other areas of the church like landscaping, gardening, painting, carpentry, etc. please consider offering your skills and expertise. Everyone is welcome to help improve our church facilities. It's the mission of the church council to keep God's house ready for his work through us.

Covid:

2. Looking ahead we feel that soon we will have the virus in the rear view mirror so we will start to plan for getting back to as close to a normal worship as possible.

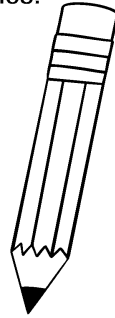


WHERE IN THE WORLD?

Jesus commands us to be his witnesses. This craft is a reminder to reach out to all our “circles.”

What you need:

- 5 bowls or cups (assorted sizes)
- Construction paper
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Brad fastener
- Crayons or markers



What you do:

1. Place the bowls and cups upside down, each on a different color of paper. Trace around the circles and cut them out.
2. With a pencil, pierce a small hole atop each circle. Layer circles on each other from largest to smallest, aligning the holes. Insert the brad through all layers.
3. Starting in the center, label the circles *my house*, *my city*, *my state*, *my country*, *the world*. Draw a picture on each one.
4. Pray, asking Jesus how you can spread his message.
